B Lochmaben Castle – interesting ruin and fine picnic spot.

C Dalton – at fork at end of village, Time Capsule with kids names at time of erection.

Points of Interest

A Kirkton conservation Village – orchard on village green (rare for Scotland).

B Dalswinton Loch – it was here where probably the world's first steamboat sailed in 1792, built by William Symington (engineer at Wanlockhead mining), sponsored by Patrick Miller, estate owner; one of the passengers was a Mr Robert Burns!

- C* Keir – 1. Forward to Courthill Smithy; 1990 plaque renovated; to give the occasion atmosphere, member Tony Mynott expected to be present with his own KM replica;
2. Return to village, TL and follow fingerposts from roadside to grave which has new plaque relating KM to his community;
3. Get MB 0930-1200 at the village hall.

D Drumlanrig Castle, etc – 1690 by 1st Duke of Queensberry, who only slept one night in it! Beautifully situated; craft shops; cafes; cycle museum, gardens, walks and tree trail.

E Durisdeer Marbles – burial-vault of the 1st Duke of Queensberry with imposing marble statues (door at back of church).

F Morton Castle – earlier seat of Queensberry Douglasses, given an exquisite setting on its promontory by the woods and the later loch.

Points of Interest (after Dumfries):-

A Kirkconnel Flow – a peat bog being restored from forestry to natural state; interpretation facility and walk.

B Kirkconnel House – claimed to have the oldest still inhabited tower in Scotland.

C Shambellie Estate woodland – many fine old Scots Pine (220 y.o.) and hardwood trees visible from the road.

D Shambellie House Museum – a renowned and changing exhibition of costumery through the ages in an impressive old house; gardens too.

E New Abbey - working cornmill.

F Sweetheart Abbey – substantial and popular ruin; name derived from legend that Lady Devorgilla kept her husband John Balliol’s heart in a casket which was buried with her there.

G No 17 Main St wall – sculpted image of 3 people in a boat hauling sandstone across the Nith for the building of the Abbey; also the rosette symbol of the Cistercian monks.

H Sandyhills, Rockcliffe and Kippford are all delightful coastal spots; bathing at Sandyhills, art at Rockcliffe, sailing at Kippford, picnicking at all!

I Loch Arthur Camphill Community “providing support and challenge for people with learning disabilities etc”; organic beef and creamery, market garden, bakery and workshops.

Points of Interest

A Kirkcudbright Artists’ Town is such a wonderful place it needs a half day to even start to do it justice. But, please take a slow tour round the old part:- at the XR TL (Royal Hotel on L); pass Museum (worth stopping to see, outside, casts of “Cup and Ring” marked rocks found around here); next XR TR (High St); soon see in the road the site of the “Meikle Yett” town gate (imagine this main street, 250 years ago, teeming with people going about their business, with lots of narrow closes, easily blocked off for defence – some remain); SO to Toll Booth and round, past Broughton House, home of E A Hornel, one of the most famous resident artists of early 20th century, to harbour.

B Tongland Bridge – a Telford/Nasmyth, 1805, earliest “hollow spandrel” (to reduce weight).

C Tongland Hydro Power Station – 1935, tours on offer of that and the dam.

D Tongland factory – not an eye-catcher, but one of the earliest concrete framed factories in the UK; produced cars (Arrol-Johnston) and munitions 1914-23; latterly staffed by women, including engineers.

E Rhonehouse – home of the largest horse fair in the land until early C20; Billy Marshall, King of the Faas (Gipsies), aged 120 at death in 1792, “never missed a horse fair” even when he was in the army!

Points of Interest

A Ruthwell Church - best preserved 8th century cross in Scotland; recovered by Rev. Henry Duncan in 1823 after being broken and buried at reformation; “international significance”.

B Ruthwell - first savings bank started by Henry Duncan in 1810; direct line down to TSB.

C Brow Well - where Robert Burns took the “healing” waters.

D Caerlaverock WWT wildfowl reserve; famous habitat for Barnacle Geese, Whooper and Bewick’s swans in winter, and Natterjack toads.

E Caerlaverock Castle – “Region’s premier castle”, c1280, unique triangular; suffered several sieges 1300 to 1570.

F Glencaple, former ocean-going and emigration port for Dumfries.

G “The Crichton”, most buildings by legacy of Dr James Crichton, originally for third attempt at university of Dumfries, but eventually for enlightened mental hospital; most patients now treated at home, so most buildings now Glasgow and Paisley university (so 4th attempt successful!) or business park; recent statue to Crichton’s wife Elizabeth near Easterbrook Hall. If time to spare, cycle more of the grounds.

H Mid Steeple, c1708, note iron mileage panel of 1827 (for main coach route to London), and Scots “ell” measure (38”), up staircase to main door. (Steeple, under repair, almost certainly still to be missing).
